They see beyond the glitter and show,


They plant where truth and purpose grow.





Star's Corner Activity: "Watch It Grow!"

What You Need:

- A piggy bank or envelope
- A sheet of paper
- One parent or older sibling to help track



Step 1: Give your child \$5 to start (or let them use their own savings).

Step 2: Tell them that each week, you will add 10% interest to whatever they saved.

(For example: If they saved \$5, they earn \$0.50 interest that week.)

Step 3: But if they take money out during the week, they lose 10% instead.


Step 4: Help them track:

- Week 1 amount
- Interest earned
- Week 2 amount
- Interest earned
- Total growth

Goal is to teach them:

- patience
- discipline
- the reward of consistency
- the cost of impulse spending

Understanding Expungements in South Carolina

How to Start the Expungement Process

You can begin by:

- Getting a copy of your full SLED criminal record
- Contacting the Solicitor's Office in the county where the charge occurred
- Asking about "Expungement eligibility"
- Completing the required forms
- Paying applicable fees (varies by charge)

Some nonprofits and legal clinics offer reduced or no-cost expungements.

An expungement is a legal process that removes certain criminal charges, arrests, or convictions from your public record. In simple terms, it gives you a clean slate, legally and publicly so that past mistakes, dismissed charges, or wrongful accusations don't continue to haunt you.

Too many of our people don't know their rights, don't know what can be removed, and don't know the impact an old record can have on jobs, housing, education, and even simple background checks. And even worse many don't know that a charge you were cleared of can still show up unless it is formally expunged.

South Carolina is an at-will state with some of the toughest barriers for people who have criminal records even records from situations where the person was innocent. Here's why expungement is crucial: Cleared doesn't mean erased. If you were found not guilty, charges dismissed, or a case dropped, it can STILL show up on background checks unless you file for expungement. This means: You can lose job opportunities, be denied housing or professional licenses, and your reputation can be damaged by something the court already released you from. Did you know that the very first self-governed town of formerly enslaved Blacks in the entire United States was right here in South Carolina?

It was called Mitchelville, founded in 1862 on Hilton Head Island long before the end of the Civil War, long before Reconstruction, and long before Black Americans were legally recognized as citizens.

Mitchelville was more than a place. It was a declaration of Black autonomy, a blueprint for self-determination, and a living example of what happens when Original people finally get the space to organize and govern themselves.

Mitchelville stands as a reminder that:

- We have governed before.
- We have built thriving communities before.
- We have grown wealth from the soil before.
- We have led with intelligence, structure, and unity before.

Mitchelville exposes the lie that Black people couldn't succeed without others directing us. We succeeded the moment we were allowed to breathe.

Mitchelville forces us to ask:

- If our ancestors built self-government under war, what stops us now?
- If they organized with no money, no rights, and no safety, what could we accomplish with today's resources?
- What would our communities look like if we governed ourselves based on love, knowledge, and discipline, not outside influence?

Mitchelville is proof that when we move with unity and consciousness, we don't just survive, we build nations.
