# Understanding's Legal Corner Freedom Under Fire: Understanding Project 2025



Project 2025 is a comprehensive conservative blueprint designed to restructure the U.S. government and roll back decades of progress on civil rights, education, healthcare, and social protections. Developed by The Heritage Foundation and other right-wing organizations, this 900-page plan seeks to consolidate power under the executive branch, dismantle federal agencies, and impose policies aligned with Christian nationalist ideals. Project 2025's agenda includes weakening or abolishing programs like the Department of Education, reducing diversity and inclusion initiatives, restricting reproductive rights, and stripping away regulations that protect marginalized communities. If enacted, it would shift the country toward a system that prioritizes a narrow, exclusionary vision of governance.

The impact on Black and Brown communities would be devastating, reversing hard-fought gains in civil rights, voting access, and economic opportunity. Project 2025 calls for the removal of diversity, equity, and inclusion programs across government institutions and universities, which would further limit access to education and fair representation. It threatens to reduce funding for social services that uplift low-income and marginalized families while strengthening policing and surveillance systems that already disproportionately harm our communities. Moreover, by targeting public schools and rewriting the historical narrative of slavery, racism, and systemic oppression, Project 2025 would erode truth-based education and the cultural self-awareness that drives liberation movements.

To counter Project 2025, we must be proactive, informed, and united in building our own power. We cannot wait for legislative changes or political saviors...our response must begin with grassroots organizing, educating our families about the threat, and protecting our voting rights. Supporting legal challenges against unjust policies, strengthening Black-owned institutions, and building community resilience will be key. Just as our ancestors fought systems designed to erase them, we too must rise and ensure that our liberation remains in our hands. Freedom is not given, it is earned, protected, and defended through collective action. Frederick Douglass reminds us "Power concedes nothing without a demand. It never did and it never will."





- Did you know she was from Mayesville, SC, a town in Sumter County?
- She advised President Franklin
  D. Roosevelt, becoming one of
  the most influential Black women
  in the White House. She was
  appointed to the Director of the
  Division of Negro Affairs within
  the National Youth Administration,
  making her the first African
  American woman to head a
  federal agency.
- Founded the National Council of Negro Women (NCNW) to uplift Black women and families.

Did you know Mary McLeod Bethune Started a School with Just \$1.50 and Turned It into a University?

In 1904, with only \$1.50, faith, and a vision, Mary McLeod Bethune opened a small school for Black girls in Daytona, Florida. She used charcoal for pencils, cardboard for tables, and transformed abandoned buildings into classrooms.

Bethune's belief was simple but powerful: "I leave you love. I leave you hope. I leave you the challenge of developing confidence in one another."

#### From \$1.50 to a University

Through determination and community support, her school grew into Bethune-Cookman University, one of the most respected HBCUs (Historically Black Colleges and Universities) in the country. She raised funds by speaking across the nation and rallying Black communities to invest in their own freedom through education.

#### Why It Matters for Us

Bethune's story is a blueprint for Nation-building: She didn't wait for someone to give her permission...she built with what she had. She showed that self-determination, unity, and vision can transform small beginnings into legacies that uplift generations.
