Peace! This month, September, I ask that we all who come in the Name of Allah reflect upon our existence and contribution to Allah's Nation whether you say we are Allah's 5% or you say we are the Nation of Gods and Earths. Ask yourself, "Am I contributing to the divine unification and building of Allah's Culture, or am I contributing to the worldly division and destroying Allah's Culture?" 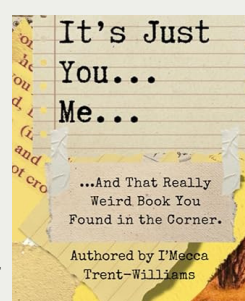
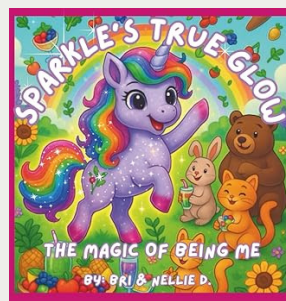

WORD OF THE MONTH: ECONOMICS

Economics (say it slowly: Eh-kuh-NAH-miks) is a big word, but it's really about something simple...how people use money and things to live and grow. It helps us understand how families, stores, and even countries decide what to buy, sell, save, or share.

Learning economics now is important because it teaches the difference between what we need (food, clothes, and a place to live) and what we want (like toys or candy). It also shows us why saving today makes the future stronger. Economics connects to everything: farming, jobs, and how we take care of our community.

Queen I-Wisdom Understanding Earth:

"Economics shows us how money moves, but credit shows us how to turn trust into power. When we understand both, we stop running after wealth and start building it. This knowledge prepares our babies to create businesses, strengthen their families, and secure the future of our Nation."

Understanding credit early is powerful. It helps us know how to buy a car, a house, start a business, or even go to school without being trapped by debt. When we build good credit, we create doors of opportunity not just for ourselves, but for our families and communities. My sister, Precious Jewels Earth, a Black woman, business owner and builder in our community and Nation, is dedicated to breaking down the importance of credit and business for our babies. She teaches that credit is not something to fear, it is something to master. Keep reading:

Passing Down Power

Too many of us inherited struggle, debt, and financial silence. It's time to break that cycle. By teaching our children credit and business from the crib, we pass down wisdom, stability, and ownership. They won't need to repair a broken foundation – they'll build skyscrapers on strong ground.

Street Justice believes the next generation deserves more than survival – they deserve ownership, power, and freedom. And it starts with us, right now, teaching them credit and business before the world teaches them struggle.

From the Crib to the Boardroom: Teaching Babies Credit & Business

Why Start So Young?

Children are natural sponges. The same way they pick up language, colors, and music, they can learn the basics of money, credit, and business. Waiting until 18 is too late – by then, habits are already formed. If we teach them young, we raise a generation that walks into adulthood equipped, empowered, and unshakable.

Credit: Their First Key

Credit is more than a score – it's a key that unlocks homes, cars, education, and business opportunities. We can help our babies understand this in simple ways:

- Piggy Bank to Bank Account – Show them how saving now grows into something bigger later.
- Authorized Users – Parents can responsibly add their kids to credit cards, giving them a head start in building history.
- Storytelling Lessons – "If you borrow a toy and return it clean, people trust you again. That's like good credit."

Business: Raising Owners, Not Just Workers

Entrepreneurship builds freedom. By letting our kids see, touch, and try business for themselves, they learn ownership early.

- Lemonade Stand Economics – Profit, reinvestment, and customer service in one summer project.
- Turning Passion to Profit – Drawing, baking, gaming – show them how to turn what they love into income.
- Family Business Exposure – Let them count money, greet customers, or help with small marketing tasks.

Understanding's Legal Corner



ATTENTION

Stacey Abrams warns that authoritarianism doesn't arrive through sudden coups, but through leaders slowly twisting democratic systems. Her "10 Steps to Autocracy" highlights the warning signs and calls on us to defend democracy. She's spreading this message nationwide through interviews, her Substack, and the #10Steps campaign.

Stacey Abrams' "10 Steps to Autocracy"

1. **Elections become a finality.** Free and fair elections are held, but the people who win ensure they are the last ones by manipulating subsequent voting processes.
2. **The executive exceeds its power.** Autocrats consolidate power by overstepping the constitutional limits of their executive authority.
3. **Competing powers are weakened.** The executive neuters or co-opts competing branches of government, such as Congress and the judiciary, and attacks anyone who disagrees.
4. **The government is "gutted."** The administration dismantles agencies and fires experts who challenge the executive's authority, weakening public institutions.
5. **Loyalists are installed.** Competent civil servants are replaced with political loyalists whose only allegiance is to the executive.
6. **Truth becomes a tool.** The ruling party controls the narrative and dismisses facts as "lies" while promoting its own falsehoods as "truth," causing public confusion.
7. **Scapegoats are blamed.** The autocrat blames specific groups for societal problems, often targeting marginalized communities to divert attention from policy failures.
8. **Opponents are eliminated.** Civil society organizations, non-profits, and educational institutions are attacked to stifle dissent and eliminate support systems for vulnerable populations.
9. **Private violence is incentivized.** The state encourages or uses private violence and intimidation to silence dissent and make people afraid. According to Abrams, this includes deploying military force against citizens and normalizing political violence.
10. **Voting becomes meaningless.** After steps 1–9 have demoralized, intimidated, and exhausted the populace, the final step is ensuring no one can vote safely or believes their vote matters, allowing the autocrat to maintain power unchallenged.

DID YOU KNOW?



The first public school for African Americans in Charleston, South Carolina opened in 1868, shortly after the Civil War. Known as the Avery Normal Institute, it was established by the American Missionary Association to train Black teachers and provide quality education to newly freed African Americans. Avery became a cornerstone for Black education in the South and produced many community leaders, activists, and educators whose influence is still felt today.

Today, the Avery Normal Institute lives on as the Avery Research Center for African American History and Culture at the College of Charleston. It preserves archives, oral histories, and exhibits that celebrate the struggles and triumphs of African Americans in the Lowcountry and beyond. Visiting the Avery is not only a chance to honor the sacrifices of those who fought for education and equality, but also a way to connect with our living history, draw strength from it, and inspire future generations to continue the legacy of knowledge, justice, and community leadership.

The Avery Institute educated many who went on to become trailblazers in leadership, civil rights, and education. Among its notable alumni are:

- **Septima P. Clark** – known as the "Mother of the Civil Rights Movement."
- **Esau Jenkins** – a community leader, entrepreneur, and civil rights activist in the Sea Islands.
- **Judge Jonathan Jasper Wright** – the first African American to serve on a state supreme court in the United States (South Carolina Supreme Court, 1870).
